

Walter H. Campbell, AAPCI Board of Trustees, is a life-long resident of the Brownsville community in Brooklyn and works with AAPCI's CEO on special-needs housing and economic development projects in the community.

Walter attended primary and secondary school in South Carolina with post training received at New York City Community College and Brooklyn College, where he received his Bachelor of Art Degree in Sociology.
